Job Summary JOB OVERVIEW

The International Subcontract Analyst is a senior finance position with a specific focus on managing and monitoring budgetary compliance for international subcontractors and collaborators for the Bixby Center for Global Reproductive Health. It is directly charged with overseeing all aspects of financial and subcontract management for programs with extensive international research base, primarily in Africa (Kenya and Zimbabwe). Responsibilities include working with programs and subrecipients to prepare budgets and justifications, submitting requests for new and amended subcontract agreements, reviewing subcontract invoices for budgetary and policy compliance, including compliance with funder guidelines, and working with subrecipients, program managers and Principal Investigators (PI) to ensure expenditures (current and projected) are in line with budgets and overall program planning.

In addition, this position will work directly with the UCSF Global Health Institute's GPRT (Global Program in Research and Training) NGO in Kenya to ensure regular communication regarding expenditure reports and budgetary adherence. Lastly, this position will be responsible for mentoring/training in-country subcontract staff to ensure systems are established for payroll management.
